


Trinity College London's English exams – GESE (Graded Examinations in Spoken English), ISE (Integrated Skills in English) and SEW (Spoken English for Work) – involve a one-to-one speaking and listening exam which allows for a genuine interaction.

In the GESE examination, **the candidate can choose and discuss a topic of his or her choice.** In Elementary level exams (from CEFR A2 to B1) the candidate may bring photographs, objects or posters about the topic to discuss with the examiner. As the candidate progresses through the levels, he or she gradually takes more control over the conversation by asking the examiner questions to find out about the examiner's view on their topic.

At the Intermediate and Advanced levels of GESE, there is an Interactive task where the candidate is expected to lead the conversation by asking the examiner questions, offering opinions and commenting on a situation given by the examiner. At Advanced levels, the candidate is also expected to challenge the examiner's comments and justify his or her own opinions.

These tasks, offered only by Trinity, allow for personalised conversational input from the candidate, **putting his or her own interests firmly at the heart of the speaking and listening exam**. This combination of realistic and personalised tasks means that every single examination is unique, just like each learner.



Immediate results after the exam session

The examiner completes a report form for each

candidate on the day of the test, which is then given to the Centre Representative at the end of the exam session. The report form indicates how well the candidate performed in each task and gives the overall provisional result. It also suggests area(s) for improvement when appropriate for future learning and development.

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Trinity exams are designed to have a positive and motivational effect on the candidate. The speaking and listening exam is **an opportunity to show how much you can do**. Our examiners work to create a friendly and supportive atmosphere that the candidate can enjoy. The unique speaking and listening exam allows the candidate to **use the English learned in the classroom in relevant, real-life situations**.

For the reading and writing components, the ISE portfolio has the same motivational aim. Candidates present the best written work that they can produce, taking time to research, draft and develop useful writing and critical thinking skills. During the speaking and listening exam, candidates then discuss their portfolio, covering not only the content but also the process of writing it.

The positive Trinity effect does not end there. Trinity has a legitimately high success rate for GESE, as **it offers small, achievable steps**. With 12 grades, there is a level suitable for every learner – no matter where they are in their English learning career. Most students enjoy finding out their provisional result immediately and leave motivated to continue their English language learning.

Use of real-life English

Trinity exams place a strong emphasis on the practical ability to use the language in context, and **encourage students to speak English just the way it is used in everyday communication**. Those who are able to ask questions, exchange opinions, respond to comments and generally interact in English using the language requirements of their level will do well in their Trinity exam.

Learners work on topics that they choose. Even at lower levels this is not only motivating but also an important factor in the development of real use of English.
