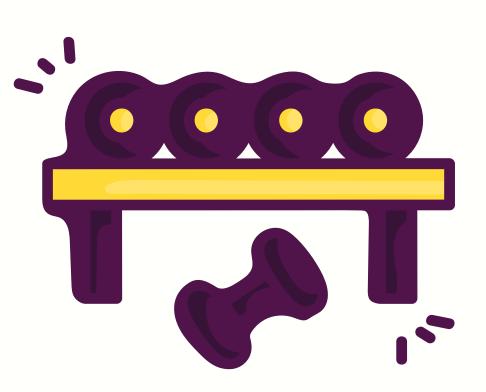






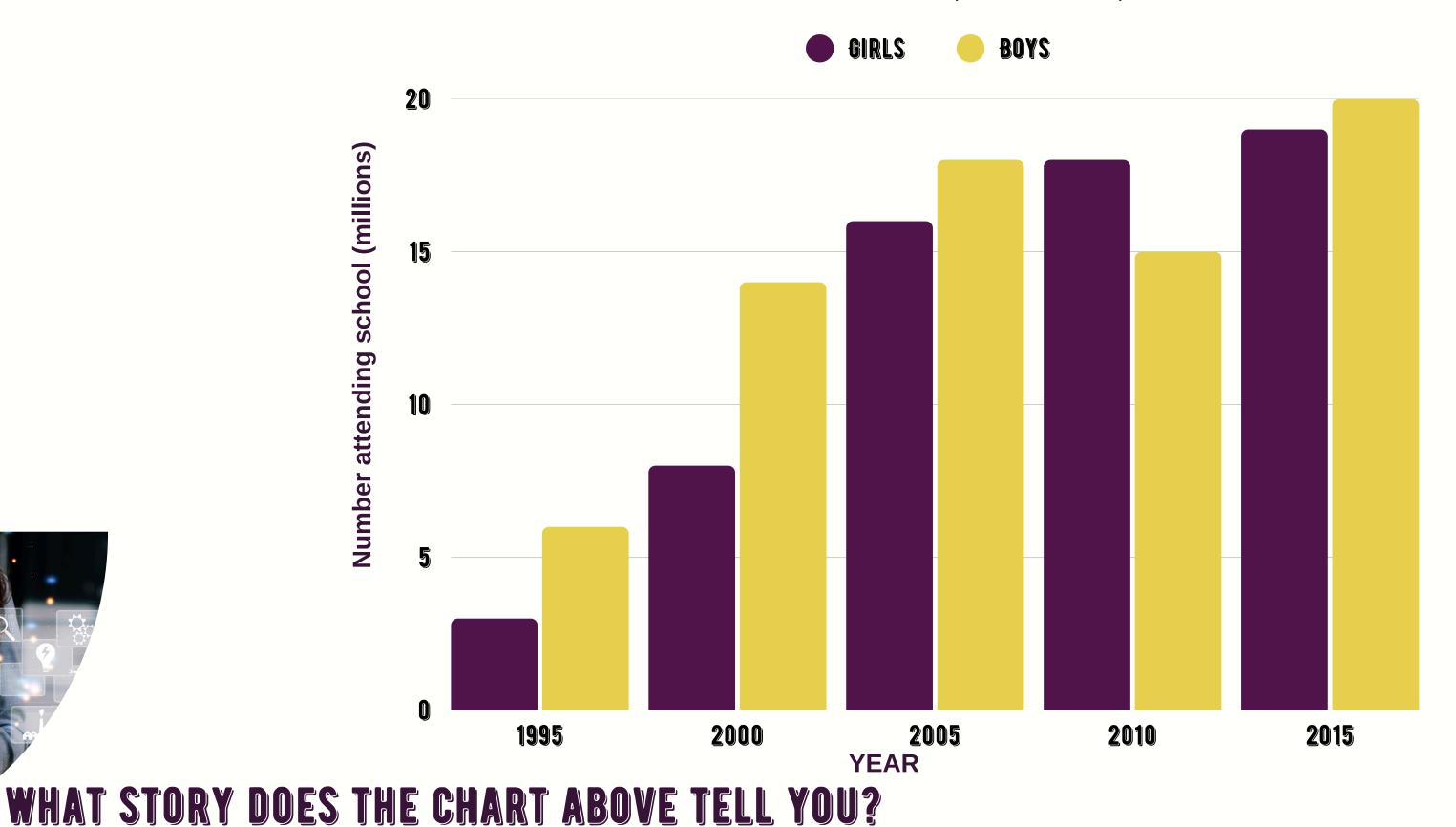
## DIGITAL/MULTIMEDIA STORYTELLING

- Vocaroo for voice recordings

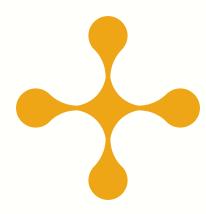

#### READING-RECEPTIVE

#### HOW STORYTELLING SUPPORTS READING

- •Storytelling help learners develop a **story schema** which supports reading comprehension.
- •Storytelling provides transferable **comprehensions** skills such as making predictions, inferences and drawing conclusions which are essential for good readers.
- •Storytelling involves repetition and using words in context thus expanding **vocabulary**.
- •Oral stories use a wide range of **lexical resources** (vocabulary and sentence structure), normally at a higher level than would be read by the learner.
- •Storytelling is expressive and models **fluent** reading.

- •Stories expose learners to **natural**, authentic speech and communication patterns.
- •Stories promote **self- expression** as every storyteller puts their own unique stamp on the story.
- •Storytelling models **pronunciation** and improves diction.
- •Storytelling can be used as a **scaffold** to encourage speaking.
- •Storytelling reduces speaking anxiety due to repetition.

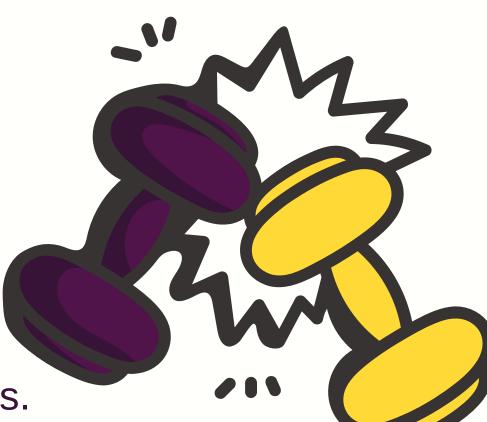
#### WRITING: PRODUCTIVE

- Stories introduce complex sentence structures, dialogues and figurative language.
- Stories serve as a foundation for different types of writing.

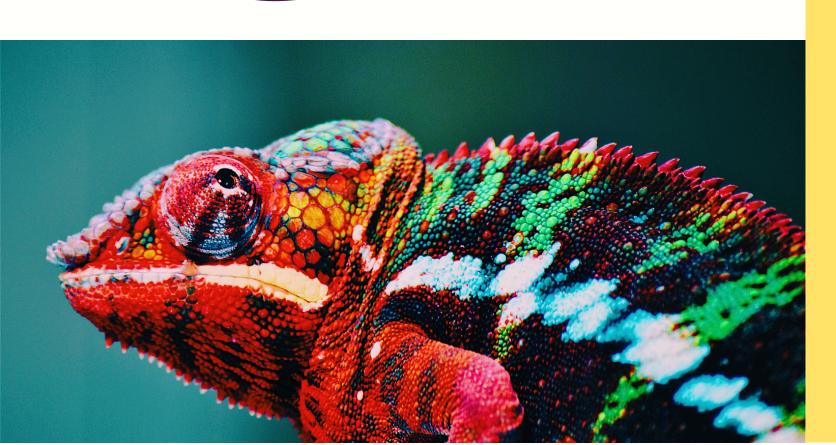








- Identify learners' interests.

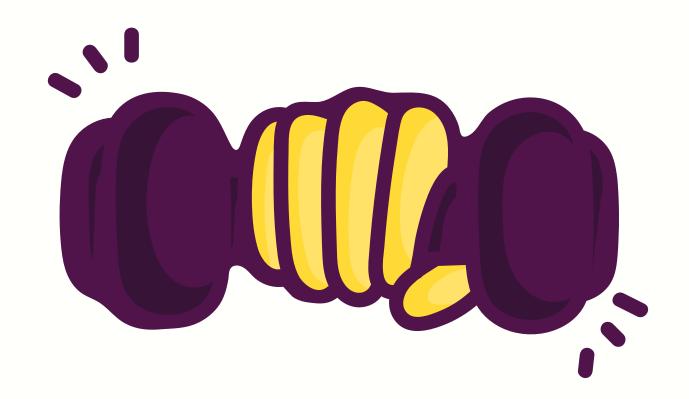

### CONCLUSION

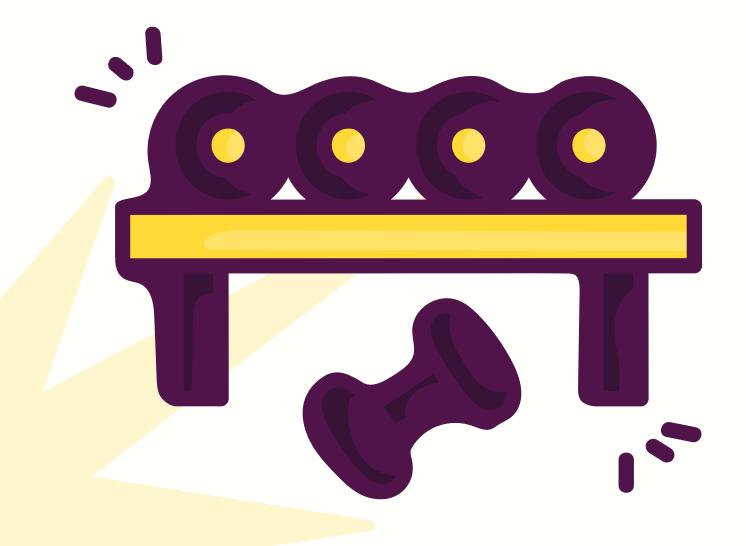
Storytelling is a "felt experience" tool that teachers at any educational level and field of study can use to elevate engagement in learning for their students.
