Task 1 – form					
2.1	Record personal details on a form correctly	4	The candidate uses form filling conventions with a high level of accuracy. They complete all of the necessary fields, and all communicative aims are achieved.		
Task 2 – article					
1.1	Present information in an appropriate format for the intended audience	3	The candidate identifies several areas of the task well. They use an appropriate style and register, and the format is suitable for an article.		
			However, the purpose for writing is only partially appropriate – the candidate started writing about his new experience, but then described advantages and disadvantages rather than what he learnt.		
1.2	Construct simple and compound sentences correctly	3	The candidate uses compound sentences with 'and', 'so', 'or' fairly consistently. The word order in simple sentences is mostly correct (eg 'I moved to a new home', 'You can socialise').		
1.3	Use adjectives correctly	4	A wide range of adjectives are used consistently, eg 'it is strange', 'new for me', 'shared home', 'foreign people'. The word order regarding adjectives in simple sentences is mostly correct.		
1.4	Use punctuation correctly	4	Full stops are used consistently at the end of sentences. Also, commas are used appropriately in a list, eg 'you can learn different ways of living, eating, drinking'		
1.5	Use upper and lower case letters correctly	4	Capital letters at the start of sentences are used with comprehensive control. Proper nouns are capitalised, eg English.		
1.6	Spell words correctly	4	The candidate uses a wide range of lexis appropriate for the task and context and shows most words are spelt correctly.

Tasi	Task 3 - email/message/postcard						
1.1	Present information in an appropriate format for the intended audience	4	The candidate writes in an appropriate format for an email and the style and register are both appropriate for the audience. The reader would be fully informed about what the candidate did at the party.				
1.2	Construct simple and compound sentences correctly	3	'And' and 'because' are used correctly to create compound sentences. The word order in simple sentences is mostly accurate. There are a range of past tense verbs that are mostly used accurately.				
1.3	Use adjectives correctly	4	A wide range of adjectives are used appropriately to extend information and convey attitude, eg 'my first Christmas party', 'a big restaurant', 'amazing'. Word order regarding the use of adjectives is consistent.				
1.4	Use punctuation correctly	3	Basic punctuation (full stops at the end of sentences) is used accurately, but there are no other examples of level appropriate punctuation evident.				
1.5	Use upper and lower case letters correctly	3	In the latter part of the email, the candidate consistently uses capital letters at the start of sentences. Proper nouns are also capitalised appropriately. However, there is inconsistent use of capital letters at the start of the text (with some words written entirely in capitals).				
1.6	Spell words correctly	3	There is a wide range of lexis used which is appropriate for the task and candidate's context. Words are generally spelt correctly. However, some errors cause difficulties for the reader, eg 'a bandane', 'corona'.				

Candidate achieves 46 marks out of 52 and passes the writing test.
