


This handy resource covers 19 different aspects of classroom teaching, from using a course book, giving and checking homework, classroom discipline, to testing and assessment. The author provides clear, concise advice, accompanied by brief explanatory notes based on her extensive international teaching experience.



This practical book will be helpful to both new teachers looking for ideas to help develop their teaching, and to more experienced teachers who want to reinvigorate their daily practice. Although the focus is on English language teaching, this text includes activities that support cross-curricular professional development in a range of contexts, from primary to tertiary - such as formative assessment for example.
