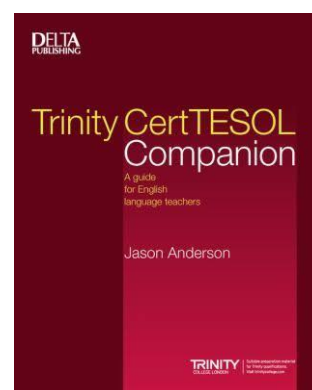


CertTESOL Companion guide launched at IATEFL
