Trinity IATEFL scholarship winners

Learning about great classroom practice

Starting this month, in the newsletters leading up to the [IATEFL 2018](#) Conference, we'll be introducing you to a Trinity IATEFL scholarship winner. This month, we're featuring the work of the TESOL scholarship winner, Peter Browning. Peter's IATEFL conference talk will explore his experience training pre-service teachers in Colombia.

During his time in Columbia, Peter noticed that some teachers were becoming disenchanted with an increasingly 'technocratic' approach to teacher training, where training was being seen as synonymous with learning 'methodologies' and 'best practice'. To help remedy this, Peter turned to sociolinguistic concepts as a way to promote the [reflexivity](#) that he believes is central to our profession.

Based on research into this area, Peter will share the scheme of work he developed for working with pre-service teachers, sharing both his and their experiences. Peter will also suggest ways in which the use of sociolinguistic concepts and reflexive practice can be implemented in different contexts. You may have seen posts from the [TEFL Training Institute](#) on Linked in or Facebook. They're by a group of experienced teachers and trainers who offer great advice about teaching and career development. As well as a blog and podcast site, there's a collection of videos showing teachers working with learners of different ages. The most recent blog about teaching mixed ability classes is a must for anyone who has to meet the many and varied demands of classes comprising different levels of learner. This multi-platform site is great for those looking to improve their practice and get ideas about how to develop and progress to the next stage in their career.
