The British Council has created a series of 12 animated videos about How Language Assessment Works. These videos, which complement Trinity's own series of 12 Introduction to Assessment Literacy videos, help to explain the test development process and key factors to be considered in the assessment of the four macro skills (reading, writing, speaking, listening), as well as assessing young learners and the role of the CEFR in language assessment.

Raising awareness of features of connected speech


The winner of the Innovation in Learner Resources category at this Year's ELTon Awards was the excellent Tim's Pronunciation Workshop from BBC Learning English.



This free series of 30 short and entertaining videos from the BBC supports learning and helps develop decoding skills. Each video explores a specific feature of pronunciation, such as elision, assimilation and weak forms, with the first episode focusing on the assimilation of the plosives /p/ and /t/.

There are also practice activities available online - perfect for new teachers learning about features of connected speech and learners wanting to practise their pronunciation.
