At CEFR level Pre-A1 I can...

- Exchange greetings and goodbyes
- Give personal information, eg name, age
- Give very short answers to simple questions

Grammar – I can understand:

- Imperatives for common actions, eg go, come, show, point, give, touch, stand up
- Question words what? how many? how old?
- Demonstratives this, that, these, those

Grammar – I can understand and use:

- ▶ The present simple tense of the verb *to be*
- Common nouns in singular and plural (regular and irregular), eg shoe/shoes, foot/feet
- Simple adjectives, eg small, tall, green
- Determiners a, the, my, your, his, her
- Pronouns I, you, he, she, it, they

Vocabulary – I can understand and use words and simple phrases for:

- Personal information
- Immediate surroundings including classroom objects
- Basic parts of the face and body
- Common animals (domestic, farm and wild)
- Numbers up to 20
- Colours
- Everyday items of clothing

Phonology – I can:

Clearly pronounce the words I have learnt

GESE Grade 1 (not available as a SELT test)

In my A1 test I can... (in addition to everything at CEFR Pre-A1)

- Tell you the position of people and objects
- Describe people, animals, objects and places very simply
- State simple facts
- ▶ Tell you about possessions
- Ask very simple questions about personal details

Grammar – I can understand:

- Present simple tense questions
- Question words who? when?
- Present continuous tense questions
- Determiner words some, any

Grammar – I can understand and use:

- Present simple tense
- There is/are and has/have got/have you got? Do you have?
- Question words where? how?
- Prepositions of place in, on, under, between, next to
- Determiner words their, its
- Possessive pronouns mine, yours, his, hers
- Yes/no answers to present continuous tense questions

Vocabulary – I can understand and use words and simple phrases for:

- Rooms in the home
- Household objects
- Family and friends
- Pets
- Possessions
- Days of the week and months of the year
- Numbers up to 50

Phonology – I can:

- Clearly pronounce the words I have learnt
- Use basic intonation patterns for simple questions
- Use contractions, eg *I've*, *I'm*, *he's*

GESE Grade 2

In my A2 test I can... (in addition to everything at CEFR Pre-A1 & A1)

- Describe daily routines and times
- Give dates
- Express ability and inability
- Give very simple directions and locations
- Describe current activities of real people or those in pictures
- Describe states in the past
- Ask simple questions about everyday life

Grammar – I can understand and use:

- Present continuous tense
- Can and can't
- Prepositions of movement from, to, up, down, along, across
- Prepositions of time on, in, at
- Prepositions of place near, in front of, behind, opposite
- Past tense of the verb to be
- Link words and, and then

Vocabulary – I can understand and use words and phrases about:

- Jobs
- Places in the local area
- Place of study
- Home life
- Weather
- Free time
- Times and dates
- Ordinal numbers up to 31st for dates

Phonology – I can:

- Clearly pronounce the words I have learnt
- Use contractions where appropriate
- Use basic stress and intonation patterns for words, short sentences and simple questions

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GESE is available in the UK as a SELT test at levels A1, A2 and B1 on the Common European Framework of Reference for languages (CEFR), and as a non-SELT test in 12 grades from Pre-A1 to C2 on the CEFR.

A2+ At CEFR level A2+ I can... (in addition to everything at CEFR Pre-A1, A1 and A2)

- ▶ Talk about past events
- ▶ Talk about future plans and intentions
- ▶ Express simple comparisons
- Express likes and dislikes
- Describe manner and frequency

Grammar – I can understand and use:

- ▶ Past simple tense of regular and common irregular verbs
- Going to future
- Like + gerund/infinitive, eg I like shopping, I like to read books
- Adverbs of manner and frequency
- Comparatives and superlatives of adjectives
- Link word but

Vocabulary – I can understand and use:

- Vocabulary specific to my topic
- Vocabulary specific to the conversation subjects
- Adverbs of frequency, eg sometimes, often, never
- Adverbial phrases of frequency, eg every day, once a week
- Expressions of past time, eg yesterday, last night

Phonology - I can:

- Clearly pronounce words for my topic and the conversation subjects
- Pronounce 'ed' past tense endings, eg played, walked, wanted
- Use appropriate weak forms and intonation in connected speech
- Avoid speech patterns of recitation

Conversation subjects – I can talk about:

Holidays

Food

Shopping

- Weekend and seasonal
- School and work
- activities
- Hobbies and sports

Topic task — I can also talk about something different of my own choice

GESE Grade 4 (not available as a SELT test)

In my B1 test I can... (in addition to everything at CEFR Pre-A1, A1, A2 & A2+)

- ▶ Talk about the future informing and predicting
- Express preferences
- ▶ Talk about events in the indefinite and recent past
- Give reasons
- ▶ State the duration of events
- Quantify

Grammar – I can understand and use:

- Present perfect tense including use with for, since, ever, never, just
- ▶ Connecting clauses using *because*
- ▶ The word *will* referring to the future for informing and predicting
- Adjectives and adverbials of quantity, eg a lot (of), not very much, many
- ▶ Expressions of preference, eg *I prefer*, *I'd rather*

Vocabulary – I can understand and use:

- Vocabulary specific to my topic
- Vocabulary specific to the conversation subjects
- Expressions relating to past and future time, eg two days ago, in the future

Phonology - I can:

- Clearly pronounce words for my topic and the conversation subjects
- Use weak forms and combination contractions, eg l've been to...
- Avoid speech patterns of recitation

Conversation subjects – I can talk about:

- Festivals
- Means of transport
- Special occasions,
- Entertainment, eg cinema, television, clubs
- Music
- eg birthday celebrations

 Recent personal experiences
