Proactively engaging teachers in CPD Ideas from Trinity TESOL's IATEFL 2019 Scholarship winner

In our second preview of speakers to look out for at the <u>IATEFL 2019</u> conference, we now look at <u>scholarship winner</u> Alexsandro Silvo, from *Cultura Inglesa, Duque de Caxias* in Brazil. Alex will be talking about challenges and strategies involved in devising professional development for teachers.



He will be looking at some of the in-house training challenges faced by his own organisation and other training providers. Challenges such as the lack of options available for formal training and certification for new and early-career teachers; the challenge of coordinating a largely heterogeneous group of teachers; and the difficulties of motivating teachers to take part in CPD. Alex goes on to suggest ways to overcome these problems, including becoming a validated course provider of a recognised qualification such as the <u>CertTESOL</u>, and how this has enabled them to offer more training options for teachers. His talk also evaluates different approaches for dealing with staff and their various needs, such as encouraging teachers to carry out peer observation and subsiding teachers' CPD.
