On Saturday 15 June the [4th Future of ELT Conference](#) was held at Regent's University, in London's beautiful Regent's Park.



With breakout sessions covering EAP, Young Learners, Technology and Teacher Education, and plenaries from Penny Ur and other ELT luminaries, this was a great event for teachers to share their knowledge and explore what the future has in store for us.

One of the highlights was Annamaria Pinter's Young Learner plenary session which showed us how far our understanding of teaching young learners has come. Starting out with a really helpful overview of the UN Convention on the Rights and Responsibilities of the Child (featuring [a great classroom resource!](#)), Annamaria went on to give some useful examples of how you can get young learners involved in classroom research. Not only did she demonstrate how this could be an inclusive classroom practice, but she also evidenced how it helped develop learners' enquiry and critical thinking skills.

Authentic Listening

Resources to develop listening skills *and* teach language

Moving on from her success with the [Real Lives, Real Listening](#) series, 'authentic listening guru', Sheila Thorn, has been busy preparing new classroom materials that use authentic listening texts that both develop listening skills and teach language in general.



Recognising that many listening texts tend to focus on development of language in general rather than specifically developing listening skills, Sheila's free worksheets and recordings show teachers how they can focus on the specific sound shapes of authentic listening to help learners in the 'sound jungle' of the real world.
