



Introduction to Trinity's Graded Awards in Music Performance

OBJECTIVE OF THE QUALIFICATIONS

Trinity's Graded Awards in Music Performance enable learners to be assessed by a music learning technology platform as an integrated part of interactive, step-by-step lessons.

The qualifications provide a structured yet flexible framework for progress, which enables learners of any age to measure their development as performers against regulated qualification levels. These take them from beginner level to the point where they can progress towards further study on their instrument, including via Trinity's face-to-face and digital graded exams.

WHO THE QUALIFICATIONS ARE FOR

Trinity's Graded Awards in Music Performance are open to everyone learning with a music learning technology platform which has registered as one of Trinity's validated course and assessment providers. There are no age restrictions or other limitations.

There is no requirement to have engaged with any formal music learning or music assessment previously, although the awards represent a system of progressive mastery and the outcomes for each level assume confidence in the requirements of previous awards. Repertoire selection and other assessment content is designed to appeal to learners of all ages and backgrounds.

PREPARING FOR THE QUALIFICATIONS

Trinity's Graded Awards in Music Performance qualifications are designed to be prepared for using a music learning technology platform. Progress and achievement are assessed through the platform, with the assessment requirements and quality assurance framework provided by Trinity. The music learning technology platform provides interactive, step-by-step lessons which underpin the preparation for these qualifications.

ASSESSMENT AND MARKING

Learners are assessed by the music learning technology platform, which assesses each piece using the [assessment criteria](#). Learning outcomes focus on musical performance on the piano. The qualifications are graded as Pass or Below Pass.

QUALIFICATION STRUCTURE

In order to be awarded the qualification, learners are required to demonstrate that they have achieved each of the learning outcomes relevant to their level of study.

Learners must complete the qualification within one year of the date of registration, unless there are extenuating circumstances. Learners who have not completed their qualification within this period will not be awarded the qualification.

DURATION OF STUDY (TOTAL QUALIFICATION TIME)

All regulated qualifications are assigned a total qualification time. This should be used as guidance only. Total qualification time is an estimate of the average time a learner spends with the music technology platform and/or with a teacher (guided learning hours) added to the average time spent learning independently and being assessed. It is recognised that the amount of time needed to commit to a qualification will be dependent on each individual's level of experience.

RECOGNITION

The assessment for Graded Awards in Music Performance focuses on music performance, pitch and rhythm, taking learners from beginner level to intermediate level. At this point they can continue their progression through other music qualifications offered by Trinity or by other awarding organisations.

TRINITY QUALIFICATIONS THAT COMPLEMENT THE GRADED AWARDS IN MUSIC PERFORMANCE QUALIFICATIONS

Trinity's music qualifications offer flexible progression routes from beginner to advanced levels in a range of musical styles. All are designed to help learners develop as musicians according to their individual needs.

Graded music exams assess a broad range of musicianship skills, including performance, while certificate exams focus entirely on performance, including separate marks for presentation skills. Trinity's graded Rock & Pop exams are available for bass, drums, guitar, keyboards and vocals. Find out more at trinityrock.com.

Learners can enter any combination of graded or certificate exams and do not need to pass any particular level in order to proceed to a higher level.

Theory exams are available from Grade 1 to support learners to develop their understanding of the technical language of music. However, no theory qualifications or other prerequisites are required to enter graded or certificate exams at any level. Find more information about theory exams at trinitycollege.com/theory.

Trinity's Awards and Certificates in Musical Development are fully inclusive qualifications for schools and other settings and are designed for those with learning difficulties across the whole spectrum of abilities and needs.

OTHER QUALIFICATIONS OFFERED BY TRINITY

- 1.2 Play and stop playing at the appropriate times
- 2.1 Perform each piece accurately with regards to pitch; any errors are limited and do not disrupt the flow of the performance
- 3.1 Perform each piece accurately with regards to rhythm, and with a sense of pulse; any errors are limited and do not disrupt the flow of the performance
- 3.2 Synchronise effectively with the backing track (where applicable)

Structure and mark scheme

Candidates perform **four** items, chosen from those in the music learning technology platform at the required level.
