The levels are sub divided into A, B and C. For example: Level 4A is the highest level of 4 when you get to 5C.

They are defined as:

A = Child has reached top of the level and is working towards the next level

B = Working well within the level

C = Child has started to work at this level

\*EP - Exceptional Performer level

## Calculating average point score: This is done from a student's outcome at GCSE.

If the candidate/teacher says I have achieved 4x B and 6x C grade at GCSE = 424 points, divide by 10 = Av. Point Score of 42.4 which would place them in the 'Expected' category and so guide them to do Grade 6 at this level.
