Activity 3: Times of day, seasons and weather (CEFR A1)

Aims:

✓ To develop skills and knowledge in speaking and listening at Entry 1

- ✓ To develop ability to talk about times of day, seasons and weather
- ✓ To practise expressing likes and dislikes
- ✓ To practise greetings and leave-taking

Exam task focus: Component 1 Task 2

Procedure:

- 1. Elicit and write up the months of the year in a list or across the board in order.
- 2. Correct pronunciation and ask a few questions to elicit in +month (eg When is Christmas? When does Ramadan start? When does this course finish?).
- 3. Divide class into four making sure each group has at least one Student with literacy and give each group a season.
- 4. Ask Students (SS) to decide which months (or part of a month) goes into their season in the
- 5. Check whole class.
- 6. Distribute Handout 1.
- 7. SS choose statements from the handout to match their season.
- 8. Take whole class feedback and check understanding of vocabulary.
- 9. Introduce *I like spring but I don't like winter*. Pause and ask *Why?* (to elicit it is cold or the days are short).
- 10. Encourage SS to make their own statements, eg Do you like summer in England?
- 11. Ask SS about seasons in their own countries.
- 12. Teach the word *changeable* about English weather. Explain English people like talking about the weather.
- 13. Elicit from SS things English say about the weather and then scribe, model and drill some examples.
- 14. Elicit onto the board *in the morning/ in the afternoon/in the evening/ at night* and elicit approximate boundaries.



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- 15. Ask SS What do you do in the morning/in the evening? What's your favourite time of day? Etc.
- 16. Tell SS It's 8.00 in the morning. It is raining! You are walking to the shops. Greet your neighbours. Say something about the weather. Elicit ideas from class.
- 17. Do three more scenarios as a whole class and then students practise in pairs using the same scenarios.

Notes on cultural awareness and appropriacy

People new to the UK can find us aloof and standoffish. Equally when we live abroad we find some customs rather tricky. It is much safer for the students to learn to talk about the weather as a neutral and non-threatening topic.

Greeting and leave taking suggestions:

- ✓ Greeting Good evening/Hello.
- ✓ Leave taking Good night/Bye.

People enjoy going to the beach in this season	


